

# Tech Trek 2022 Is Still Evolving

Tech Trek is the AAUW California developed science/ math summer camp for girls entering the 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Traditionally, OUR branch sends girls to Camp Blackwell at the University of California, Santa Barbara. Elizabeth Blackwell was the first American woman to receive a M.D. in 1848. Her younger sister Emily also became a doctor. Horizons for girls in the STEM field have been expanding in recent years, but females are still underrepresented, especially in engineering. Last year's Tech Trek focused on engineering, particularly robotics. Plans are evolving to provide an in-person camp in 2022. UC Santa Barbara includes experiences in oceanology and ecology. We have not yet received our branch packet, so we do not know the specific structure, selection process and regulations for the 2022 camp. We do know that costs will increase. We thank all of the donors who have contributed to OUR Tech Trek account. You will help provide a wonderful learning experience for middle school girls. Branch members may also participate in the selection process by reading applications and interviewing applicants. To learn more about the camp's namesakes, read The Doctors Blackwell by Janice P. 

# **HOUSE OF RUTH**

### AAUW SUPPORTS THE BUILD BACK BETTER BILL

The *Build Back Better* bill (H.R. 5376) has passed the House and is now in the Senate. This bill has

three provisions that are critical to our mission:

- universal paid family and medical leave up to 12 weeks
- an extension of the child tax credit through 2022
- affordable childcare

The United States has been experiencing a marked decline in female labor force (as presented in past OUR Public Policy articles) relative to its peers. "While countries like France, Canada and the UK (countries with paid leave policies) all had female labor force participation rates similar to the United States 30 years ago, their rates have continued to climb while the U.S.'s has declined." The United States is the only country in the Organization for Economic Co-operation and Development (OECD) that does not have mandate paid medical maternity leave." (Joint Economic Committee Democrats website)

Paid family and medical leave "makes the employees more likely to remain with the company following a critical life experience like having a child or caring for an ill family member, and it helps the company cultivate better employee talent, engagement, morale and productivity." ("Why Paid Family LEAVE IS good business" The Boston Consulting Service,2017) California has had paid family leave for many years; 91% of employers say it has had a positive or no effect on business profits.

Here are two ways you can help this legislation through the Senate:

- Respond to the Two-Minute Activist ("Take Action") request from National, and urge your members to do the same. Even though our senators are in support, they need to hear it from us that these three provisions must not be amended out.
- If you have friends or family in Arizona or West Virginia, urge them to put pressure on their senators to vote "yes."

Also, the Advisory Board to the National Public Policy Committee is producing a series of webinars on "tough policy issues." Watch for more info from National to all members.

Investigating how we could help in other ways, we found that high schools need small kits with basic items, especially feminine hygiene products, shampoo, toothpaste, etc., for teens who come to the nurse's office during the school day with these needs.
